



"This is a sign for you; you will find a newborn baby wrapped snugly and lying in a manger." Luke 2:12 CEB

Every Advent my sister and I had calendars to mark down the days to Christmas. Sometimes they were a strip of red cloth with a bell on its bottom. We had to untie a peppermint candy each day, inch by inch, stooping lower and lower, until on Christmas we could ring the little bell.

Other years we had bits of chocolate hidden behind pictures of angels, shepherds, and wise men. Inch by inch, we lifted flaps and left empty spaces until the nativity scene covering the treats was a mess of holes and smeared faces. It was a good habit to get into-this waiting for Jesus to come. It was good to look forward to something, to some birth, to something new, to a fresh, fragrant moment in the dull grass, and the bare trees of a Michigan winter.

The people in the years before Jesus' birth were used to waiting for God, for a time when swords would be beaten into plow blades and nations had long forgotten about war, for something worth hoping for, worth believing in and for a sign of how great God's love was for each and every one of us.

Some shepherds came, some astrologers from the Eastern lands arrived and what they saw satisfied some mystery in their hearts, took the chill of a dark and deep night and gave them a touch of God's loving hand that they could not help but thank God for as they scattered back into the lands they came from, even though it was only a birth, only a baby. Inch by inch, this child would grow into something far grander.

As we wait for Christmas once again, inch by inch, day by day, we look for something, some hope, some promise, some reassurance, some flash of God's sweet grace, more delicious than any candy we can find, more healing than any bandage, and more shivery with excitement than any bell that could ever ring

May it be so for you and for all in some small, every-growing way during this Advent Season.


