Giving Tuesday

"In everything I have shown you that, by working hard, we must help the weak. In this way we remember the Lord Jesus' words, 'It is more blessed to give them to receive." Acts 20:35 CEB

While I was reflecting over this passage, I checked the Gospels to discover the origin of Paul's quote. None of the Gospels we have list it. It is likely that he was quoting from oral tradition passed down disciple to disciple in those early days of the Church. It is, however, a sentiment that Jesus would have readily agreed with. Jesus was about the business of building a more caring and just society and that work would require the willingness to share and to put each others' needs before our own. Paul carried on that work, working as a tent maker so that the congregations he founded did not have to support him with a salary. Instead they could put that money to work taking care of the elderly, the infirm, and the destitute that had found a home in their gatherings. Paul saw this clearly as walking down the path that Jesus had called him to go, a path he saw as a necessity for anyone who claimed to be a follower of Jesus.

This is the season of thanksgiving and what better way to show our thanks than by showing generosity? In America, though, our annual day of thanks is followed by one of the busiest shopping days of the year: Black Friday. Touched by riots and by other outward expressions of rampant greed, Black Friday has a checkered history indeed. The name itself marks a Stock Market disaster. On September 24, 1869, two investors drove up the price of gold, the standard the United States currency depended upon, so high that it caused the market to collapse, setting off an economic recession. Its association with shopping began in Philadelphia in the 1950's as a police nickname for the crowds that descended upon downtown shops after Thanksgiving, increasing their workload. By the 1960's, the nickname became so commonplace that it was regularly featured in advertising fliers. Though I have talked to many who have enjoyed quality family time shopping and dining out with the relatives on the day after Thanksgiving, the day should give every follower of Jesus some pause. The day does focus on acquisition, not on giving-although to be fair, many are buying presents for friends and loved ones. Could we who follow Jesus find another way, perhaps a way that allows us to spread our blessings further and wider by sharing them with others?

Unsurprisingly, someone came up with such a way. The 92nd Street Y and the United Nations Foundations surmised that people might be inclined to be generous as the holidays approached and after they had saved so much money on presents shopping on Black Friday. The organizations proposed calling the Tuesday following that Friday 'Giving Tuesday' and launched a fundraiser supporting their respective organizations in 2012. It was a resounding success and sparked many other non-profits to follow suit. According to a 2020 report on Giving Tuesday, 16 million people worldwide donated \$503 million online that year, a five percent increase over 2019. Giving Tuesday turned out to be a fine suggestion to help people be generous in an organized and focused manner.

As I consider this, I wonder what would happen if we treated Giving Tuesday with the enthusiasm and forethought as many of us, with our camping equipment and our willingness to wait in staggering lines, approach the early sales on Black Friday? What would happen if we all mailed a check or clicked on PayPal to donate to organizations working for societal improvement? One year let us take on drug addiction treatment. Another year-homelessness. Another-cancer treatment and prevention. Still another-the prevention of hate crimes. The problems and the non-profits dedicated to solving them are numerous. We could go through many Giving Tuesday before we exhausted the causes. Surely each cause, each organization would benefit from a surge of interest and attention. Who knows what progress we might make, what solutions we might provide?

I know Jesus and Paul had no way of imagining Giving Tuesday, but I suspect that they would rally around its spirit. They might even suggest that we carry over the generosity to the rest of the days of the week. And what miracles would we provoke if we did that! But all movements start small so let us start with just a day. So let us take one Tuesday, look up a charity we unabashedly support, and give the amount that we might have spent on a present for someone who no longer has room for all the things they already have. You can send them a note that you made a donation in honor of him or her. We might discover that our spreading around our generosity around might make a difference in a life, in a movement, and in our society as a whole. Indeed, maybe in our giving we may discover, for all the good it might do, it is better to be giving than it is to receive.
