"My plans aren't your plans, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord."

Isaiah 55:8 CEBAs

I was recovering from a minor bout with Co-Vid last summer, I decided to go to Sunday worship. I did not have the energy to drive to another church (I was on sabbatical so I could not attend my own) and I was reluctant to expose people to whatever remnant of the virus I possessed so I opened my laptop and began to search.

I scrolled through a list of local churches of my denomination. I had a good variety to choose from. I picked one that I had not visited before. My screen filled with a white, well-lit sanctuary with a simple brown altar abutted by a pulpit and a lectern. From the wideness of my view, I suspected that the camera was in the corner of the balcony. An open door next to the chancel invited me to gaze on a hallway that probably led to the offices and the Sunday School wing. In my imagination, I caught myself walking through that doorway and exploring whatever lay beyond. A voice interrupted my daydream and asked for my forgiveness for a poor internet connection. I must admit that I never imagined watching church online in the way that I would watch a YouTube video, let alone interacting with people through the wires and the algorithms that make up the internet. For me the church has always about physical presence. I can hear people shuffling people to and from their pews. I can smell their perfumes and their colognes. I can taste the blandness and the sourness of the communion wafer and grape juice. Finally, I can feel the pew cushions sink beneath me as well as the solidity of the wood supporting my back. These may not be essentials of worship-prayer and listening to a sermon are as ineffable as the air itself, but the physicality of a sanctuary adds a touch of reality



to something that could easily become an abstract. And yet, here I was murmuring the prayers from sheets of paper I had printed off ahead of time. I paid close attention to the reading of the Bible and to the sermon, taking notes on what I found most intriguing. I watched the lay readers walk from their seats to the lectern and back. I typed a note of thanks into the chat box. I even found myself singing along with the hymns-something that I seldom do when I worship in person because I am usually wearing a microphone. The technician running the online feed was careful to include me in the service. She responded to my note of thanks with a word of appreciation. She asked me where I was and how I had heard about the service. She encouraged me to come back to join another service. Though I was not physically present, though I could not feel someone shaking my hand and I could not feel the pressing of air by me as I stood talking to people in the hallway, somehow I felt as though I had been there. I have found myself recently tuning into a variety of my denomination's church services most Sunday evenings. I listen especially to a variety of pastors' sermons. I think of it as doing research, as learning different angles on the Bible we all share in common, and as borrowing ideas I find inspiring and promising. However, that is not the whole of the story. I watch because it has become part of my way of worshiping God. I find it hard to focus on being open to God while leading worship. Too many details distract-will the lay reader pronounce the hard words correctly, will we have enough servers and elements for communion, and will I miss a visitor afterwards and leave them feeling unwelcome? Sometimes leading worship is like being a stage manager for a play. You are more aware of the pieces than you are of the whole purpose of why you are gathered there. I am not suggesting that I find my prayers empty or the songs less than uplifting. I am admitting, though, that real worship only comes in fragmentary moments when I lead worship. So I find myself sitting as the sun sets waiting to worship. The computer screen commands my attention. I am surrounded by silence, broken only the mewing of my cat. I listen. I pray. I absorb the music. My body calms and I pay attention. It is here, thanks to the strange miracle of electronics and ethereal communication, I find myself waiting for God. Isaiah, in the midst of Israel's struggle through their exile in Babylon and their efforts to reconstruct their world after they returned home, reminded us now that our walk with God is always a mystery. We cannot predict anything about God except the capacity of God's love. And that boundless capacity will undoubtedly include people and situation that we cannot imagine and often do not desire.

We can make plans and we can plot our lives on our mental maps, but what we cannot do is coerce God to go along with them. God allows us our freedom, but God invites us to reorient ourselves to new directions and new relationships when we least expect them. And those new experiences will change us, will altar the way we will go. God does, not pull strings as a puppeteer might, but to urges us to grow and to prosper. The Exile and the Reconstruction made the people Israel more compassionate and more humble people and their example made Jesus possible. God does indeed work in ways we never expect. Just as I never expected to get much out of a computerfed worship service. But I do. And I suspect that I will continue to do so. Rather than grousing about change and about how things used to be, maybe I should just give thanks to God. That is where all good gifts arise.
